## Engage, Empower, Involve

Sisters!

This month, I'm opting to tell you all a little about what school has looked like so far this year. As you may know, about 1/3 of Knox County has chosen to go virtual, while the rest are attending school in person. As a school counselor, that makes my job look a lot different.

In a "normal year", we would be able to go into classrooms a little more frequently and do presentations on college prep topics, as well as social emotional concerns. This year, like all teachers, we've had to create an online class in Canvas, with lessons, office hours, and ways to schedule appointments. We aren't able to accommodate drop in appointments in an attempt to help control spread. We've also learned about really interesting things like creating a bitmoji (an animated "selfie", if you will), and Teams. On any given day, I have Teams chat open, for my students who are virtual, my email open, my student information system open, and a third screen available for any meetings that are being held virtually. These include IEPs, faculty meetings, department meetings, etc. Again, to help control potential spread of infection., we can't meet in groups.

In December, Knox County made the decision to take the whole district virtual. There is a huge difference between meeting with students in person and meeting virtually. As an example, prior to the district making this move, I was afforded the opportunity to observe a virtual class in action. While inhouse teachers are able to get feedback and communication with most of their students (because they're right there), that didn't seem to be the case in a virtual high school class. There seemed to be a handful who would participate, and a whole lot of blank screens, because students have their cameras turned off.

What I learned is this: the teachers with whom I work every day, have gone to great lengths to learn a new platform for teaching in an incredibly short amount of time. They've learned how to create online lessons, interactive activities, quizzes, and all kinds of other things to make learning as interesting and engaging as possible. Some of these teachers opted to teach an additional class to ensure students could get the classes they need at the expense of having a planning period. For the in-house teachers who have had to quarantine or have had students who have had to quarantine, they have continued to teach online, while providing resources online for those students to help ensure that those students don't fall behind.

As a counselor, working in a virtual setting is more challenging. We're a lot more reliant on email and Teams meetings in those situations. It's harder to reach students, teachers or administrators than it is when working in the building. During this past week, I got a hefty dose of the experience since I, myself, was quarantined. I have nothing but respect for teachers, counselors and principals who choose to work in virtual school settings. It is definitely a different mindset.

As we go forward through this semester, we may get better at going back and forth between the inperson and virtual settings, but suffice it to say, it may be the hardest year that we, as educators, face in our careers. Please continue to keep us all in your thoughts and prayers as we go forward.


