

Shannon Exum



Meet Zeta member Judy Fleenor



Judy is a native Knoxvillian, a 1964 graduate of Fulton High School and a December 1967 graduate of UTK with a BS in Social Studies Education. She began working for the Knoxville City Schools returning to Fulton High as librarian, December 1967 and continued her employment with the Knox County system for 39 years, 6 months. She was a librarian and seventh grade geography teacher serving in elementary, junior high, and high schools. Judy earned the MSLIS degree from UTK in 1973 and then in 1991 completed the 45 hours beyond the masters. (Dr. June Gorski was one of her professors. Judy scanned Seventeen magazines to determine the effect the advertisements had on teenage girls. Judy and June hoped to publish the findings but that didn't occur. Judy still earned a good grade for her work.) She was awarded the Louise Meredith School Library Award, given by the state library organization, while she was librarian at Rule High School. Judy was a career ladder level III teacher. She was also a member of the 1991 Leadership Education class.

Judy retired in May 2009 after fifteen years at West High School. She then moved to Hunter's Crossing development to be closer to her church.

Judy was raised in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and has been a member of the Beaver Creek congregation since 1975. She has served the church in several capacities: member of the session, member of the personnel committee, member of the missions and outreach committee, member of the carnival committee (she chaired this committee and organized the first community carnival), church librarian, and is currently helping in the church office after the retirement of the administrative assistant.

Judy has been a member of Zeta Chapter since November 1973. When she was chair of the research committee, she compiled the first history of the chapter. This history was updated for the chapter's 85th anniversary. Judy has served the chapter as vice-president and president for two terms. Judy has attended Xi State, Regional, and International conventions. She attended the Leadership Management Seminar in 1985, and the Advanced Management Seminar in 1993 and has always said these were the two best professional meetings she ever attended.

In retirement, Judy has helped in the library at Copper Ridge Elementary School, has served as colibrarian for her church, and has helped fill-in for her church's administrative assistant. She has been a member of three bridge clubs playing three times a month. She has also been involved in the Body Works exercise program.
